# Chalet Bighorn, Revelstoke

USP: Private helipad. FOOTPRINT: A bear's paw of 1,400 square metres. SLEEPS: 16 (the eight bedrooms are twice the size of any in the French Alps). The apex of chalet luxury in North America at the pinnacle of heli-skiing, Revelstoke is where it all began in 1970-heli-skiing from one of the snowiest towns on earth, with an annual fall of between 12 and 18 metres (Zermatt has four), where in the pub called the Village

> Idiot the seats are made out of old skis. Now add extreme luxury: Chalet Bighorn ticks all boxes, but the indoor pool and outdoor hot tub, the sexy ski room, the spa, the private cine

ma, the teppanyaki grill and the starched staff are a mere bagatelle compared to the helipad. Just as you are delving into a delicately boiled breakfast egg, a Bell 205 12-seater swoops across the Columbia River and descends outside the drawing-room window. Within minutes you're off with your rockers-super-wide skis for surfing the great white tide through the snow ghosts (conifers hunched under sparkling capes). This thrashes the finest bespoke skiing in the world. The champagne powder is waist-high: a metre of the gossamer lightness of sitting on a base twice as deep. And if the conditions are too cloudy, Bighorn has a big advantage over every other heli-skiing gig: your chauffeur can drive you down to the gondola that will whisk you 1,750 verts (vertical metres, but use the lingo) up Mount Mackensie to the longest runs
