

## **ALPINE RESPONSIBILITY CODE**

THERE ARE ELEMENTS OF RISK THAT COMMON SENSE AND PERSONAL AWARENESS CAN HELP REDUCE. REGARDLESS OF HOW YOU DECIDE TO USE THE SLOPES, ALWAYS SHOW COURTESY TO OTHERS. PLEASE ADHERE TO THE CODE LISTED BELOW AND SHARE WITH OTHERS THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR A SAFE OUTDOOR EXPERIENCE.



Know the Code - Be Safety Concious

WSAA It is Your Responsibility

- Always stay in control. You must be able to stop, or avoid other people or objects.
- People ahead of you have the right-of-way. It is your responsibility to avoid them.
- 3 Do not stop where you obstruct a trail or are not visible from above.
- 4 Before starting downhill or merging onto a trail, look uphill and yield to others.
- If you are involved in or witness a collision or accident, you must remain at the scene and identify yourself to the Ski Patrol.
- Always use proper devices to help prevent runaway equipment.
- Observe and obey all posted signs and warnings.
- **8** Keep off closed trails and closed areas.
- 9 You must not use lifts or terrain if your ability is impair through use of alcohol or drugs
- You must have sufficient physical dexterity, ability and knowledge to safely load, ride and upload lifts. If in doubt, ask the lift attendant.

## STAY IN BOUNDS! DON'T YOU PUT OUR







PLEASE DON'T PUT OUR RESCUERS AT RISK. The terrain outside the ski area boundary at RMR is uncontrolled and unpatrolled. Mt. Mackenzie is conically shaped and if you leave the Ski Area Boundary you can quickly find yourself in avalanche terrain, un-skiable cliffs, and/or a long way from the Ski Area. DO NOT follow tracks if you don't know where they go! There will be an automatic minimum \$500.00 rescue cost for people assisted by RMR staff outside the Ski Area Boundary.
